James Henry Callaway was born January 14, 1859, a little over two years before the Civil War began. James Buchanan was president and the big topic of the day was slavery. The western movement in the United State was in full swing and would last another 40 years. James was born in the state of Illinois to Richard M. B. Callaway and his wife Harriet. Richard descended from a long line of Callaways' who had immigrated from Cornwall England sometime in the 1600's. James's great great grandfather, Col. Richard Callaway, had moved his family from Virginia to Boonesboro Kentucky in the 1765 to join with Daniel Boone in the land sales business. Indians killed Col. Richard in his back yard in 1780. The descendants of Col. Richard moved with the Boone family to east central Missouri early in the 1800's. There are two counties in Missouri named after the two families. James's parents probably lived in Kentucky and were visiting when James was born. (both his parents had been born in Missouri) He was the first of eight children all of whom were born in Kentucky except him. The family moved from Henry County Kentucky to Trimble County sometime before 1870.

James was 15 when his Mother, Harriet, died at the age of 35 leaving his father with eight children to raise. U. S. Grant was President and reconstruction was going strong. The following year Rutherford B. Hayes was elected President by one (1) vote. At the same time Thomas A. Edison was demonstrating his new invention the phonograph at the White House. James's father married some 10 months after his mother's death to a spinster lady, Susan Stockdale. According to a story that James told his youngest child, Virginia, his new wife, Susan agreed to keep only some of the children and that she would pick out the children she was willing to keep. The children were lined up in the yard and Susan picked the ones she wanted. James, reportedly was one that was picked to keep, but his brother Bill was not, so he would not stay without Bill. They left and began to walk. The boys walked from farm to farm offering labor for something to eat and a place to sleep. They walked and worked their way from Kentucky to Texas from 1874 to 1879/80 when James wound up in Ennis, TX. The story goes on to say that he met a farmwoman there who taught him to read and write.

When James reached Ennis in 1880 James A. Garfield had ben elected President only to be assassinated in July of 1881. In 1886, one year after James and Emma's first child was born, the statue of liberty was dedicated and Mark Twain published "Huck Finn". The Texas State records reflect that a James H. Callaway married a Mattie M. Carpenter on October 27, 1881. No one in the family knows anything about this and while it could be assumed that it was a different James H. the fact that the rural part of Ellis County Texas was so sparsely populated we assume it was he. There is no record of the marriage after that so it could be assumed that she died without children. He then married Emma Creech October 25, 1884. Emma and James had eight children. They lived in Kaufman County where he farmed until 1896. They moved to Newlin, Texas in Hall County (Newlin is located on the Childress / Hall county line approximately 4 miles north of Esteline and perhaps a mile east of Highway 287. We think that Jesse -1885, Charley - 1888, Floyd - 1890, Jewel - 1895, and Earl - 1896 were born in Kaufman County. They stayed in Hall County farming until 1902 then moved to Hereford in Deaf Smith County, TX. Lee in 1898 and Lois in 1901 were born in Hall County. When the family moved to Hall County the United States was enjoying the "Gay Nineties", Grover Cleveland was President, Duryea invented the first American Automobile, Henry Ford produced the first Ford car, Marconi invented the "wireless telegraph" and the Spanish American War was in the offing. In the 1900 Hall county census James's brother Fleet is listed in the house. He may have been visiting or living with them - Fleet was 33 at the time.

In Hereford Texas the Capital Syndicate was in the process of selling off blocks of their 3,000,000 acre XIT ranch. They were hiring "sales agents" to accomplish this. They would lure prospective buyers from the east traveling by train and the agents would try to interest them in a purchase. James came to Hereford hoping to be hired. When the family got to Hereford Theodore Roosevelt was President, having inherited the job when William McKinley was assassinated. Frank Lloyd Wright built his first "prarie style house", the Wright brothers made their famous flight, and Einstein promulgated his theory of relativity. Their stay in Hereford included a nice home close in. There their last child, Ruby, was born only to die after a couple of months in 1903. In 1904 Emma's health began to fail and she died on July 14, 1904. According to a story that Betty Callaway Blair heard, James sent for a "mail order bride", soon after Emma's death, in an effort to try to keep the family together.

This, mail order bride, evidently did not work out as no record of it exists. Soon after Emma's death the three oldest Boys, Jesse 19, Charley 16, and Floyd 14 went out on their own while James took the four younger children back to Ennis where he placed them in a Children's home with the exception of Jewel who stayed with an Aunt.

When Emma died in 1904 and James was forced to break up his family, he moved to Childress Texas. Childress was booming with railroad activity and he began to build commercial and residential buildings. The same year, 1904, Walter P. Chrysler (later to found and become President of Chrysler Auto Company) also moved to Childress. In Chrysler's biography is a description of Childress that year. "Childress, a little village south of the Red River, near the southwest corner of Oklahoma. Childress was just a little village and the most godforsaken dusty place you could imagine. Chrysler could only find one house for rent; a four room unpainted box without a single convenience, stuck in the middle of an 8-acre cornfield. The only water nearby came from a sulfurous well. That meant water would have to be hauled in from elsewhere." The economic activity in Childress was created when the Railroad shops located in Clarendon burned in 1902 and were being rebuilt in Childress because of its more central location. There were three railroads know as the "Panhandle System" located there.

In 1906 a record of the history of the Central Christian Church of Childress lists James Henry Callaway as Clerk and Treasurer during the founding of the Church, he remained a member until 1930 when he moved to the Central Church of Christ where he stayed until his death. He was successful and active in the town. He met Miss Ada Hughes, who was a clerk at Mikels' dry goods store, and they married May 21, 1908. He then went to Ennis to bring Jewel-13, Earl-12, Lee-10, and Lois-7 to live with he and Ada in Childress. He was 49 and Ada was 34 when they married.

He and Ada had four girls, Ruth-1909, Fern-1910, Elizabeth-1911, and Virginia 1913. He continued in the building business. One of his practices was to build a house, move into it, sell it, and then build another one. In 1916 he built the house at 601 Avenue B North East, Ada put her foot down and said they would move no more. They lived there until he died Nov. 4, 1943 shortly before his 85th birthday.

James continued his construction business until 1922 when he was elected Childress County Judge. He served 4 years until 1926 and forever after that was referred to as Judge Callaway. In 1922 Warren Harding was President, Yankee Stadium was opened and named "the house that Ruth built". In 1925 the famous "Scopes Monkey Trial" took place with attorneys' William Jennings Bryan vs. Clarence Darrow. In 1927 Lindbergh made the transatlantic flight from New York to Paris.

In 1930, at the age of 71, James was elected Justice of the Peace. The great depression was on and times were very hard. Franklin Roosevelt was inaugurated President in 1933 and instituted his New Deal. Hitler was named chancellor in Germany and WWII was being planned. James served as Justice of the Peace until 1936. His eyesight had gotten so bad he could no longer recognize anyone. He had grieved about his eyes for some time and in 1943 went to Oklahoma to see daughter Jewel who's husband, Dr. J. W. Phillips, accompanied him to Tulsa. There Cataract surgery was performed. When the cataract was cut it shattered and he was in pain for the rest of his life. In August of 1943 he went back to Oklahoma to visit Jewel where he had a stroke and fell off the porch. He never recovered from the fall and died in November.

James Henry Callaway died November 4, 1943 just three weeks before his grandson, Earl Callaway Jr.'s ship, the Aircraft Carrier, Escort USS Liscome Bay (CVE-59) sank after taking a Japanese torpedo off Makin Island in the Gilberts on November 24, 1943. He was the first of two of his grandson's to die in WWII. Earl Jr.'s brother, Jack was shot down over Japan just two months before the war ended. In all there were 8 grandsons and one grandson-in-law to serve in the military the other 7 were:  
Burl Callaway - Seabee; Cleo Callaway - Navy; Thad Callaway - Army; Max Callaway - Navy pilot; Bill Phillips - Air Force; and Jiggs Caldwell (Lela's husband) - Seabee. C. W. Callaway, Jr. was in ministerial school and thus deferred. He had 24 grandchildren in all.

James Henry was 6'3" tall, had red hair, and blue eyes. He had always claimed that his father and his father's brother came from Ireland. We can only speculate about the reason he would tell such a story.

He did, by any measure, have a very difficult life probably widowed twice. He was successful in his business life and social life. He was a devout Christian and raised all his children to be the same. Ten of his twelve Children reached adulthood and nine produced children of their own and we are now in the 6th generation. A good many of his heirs are in the ministry or closely tied to the Church in one way or the other.

Dad's life was changed as a young boy when his mother passed away when he was thirteen years old. He took his mother's death hard, and I remember him speaking of this tragedy many years later. His dad put the younger children in an orphan's home for awhile, as he sorted out his own life. Dad and Charley were old enough to work, and I don't remember Dad ever saying that he finished school. They went out on their own, and first went into a drayage business and then into the lumber industry. After a while Dad decided to strike out on his own and headed west to Portland, Oregon. He and Charley parted in a friendly manner, and they corresponded for many years, and had occasional visits. They both remained in the lumber business, and were good at mathematics, and had much in common.

When Dad arrived in Oregon he went to work at a lumber company and during this time met my mother Edna Deakins. They were married on May 10, 1916 when my mother was 16 and Dad 26. He was called up to serve his country in the Army during WWI. The Army used Dad's lumber experience to select wood for the construction of WWI airplanes. Dad military service was in Vancouver, Washington, and mother remained with him. She survived the terrible influenza that killed many people during 1917-1918. Dad never went overseas, and when he was discharged they moved to the San Francisco Bay area. This area remained their home for the rest of their lives.

Dad and Mom adopted my sister Dorothy Jewel in 1926, and much to everyone's surprise I was born several years later on August 18, 1932.

My earliest memories of doing things together with my father was riding in the car and helping him deliver his products. He delivered sash and doors when needed, to his customers, and enjoyed having me go with him. Dad was an excellent salesman, and always went over and beyond the call of duty to please them. In today's language he would be called a workaholic. He worked for Western Door and Sash Company in Oakland, CA for many years. His work ethic was very strong, and dad was a true believer in working very hard. If a delivery could not be met by the company, he hand-delivered it to his customers. Needless to say he was well regarded by them. We often took them to lunch, and stayed to chat for awhile. He was a good provider for his family, and provided an above average income for us. He and Mom were products of the depression, and had know hard times, but they always were able to put food on the table, and keep a roof over our heads.

Dad was a happy man most of the time, and loved to whistle. I can still see him today going about his chore's whistling a merry tune. He love to stay up with all the latest news and sports through his radio, and he often had a ball game on. On many occasions we enjoyed seeing the Oakland Oaks team in Emeryville, CA. He loved his politics and followed them closely, a true Republican, he loved to argue a point. He was very set in his ways, and had a regular schedule that he did not like to have altered. He always wore a hat and tie when we went out, even at picnics! Virginia and Elizabeth (his half sisters) moved to the bay area and he always kept in close touch with them. They and their families were part of our holiday celebrations and picnic outings. There was lot's of visiting in those days, and when Robert and Virginia came over their son Bobby and I had the best of times. Dad would give us scraps of wood, and nails and a hammer, and we kept busy for hours. We also liked to hike in the hills. Elizabeth, Daryl, and Doris also came by, and Doris and I enjoyed more "girly" fun. Aunt Jewel and Dad were lifetime correspondents, and saw each other several times for visits. Earl and his family lived close enough for visits when they moved to the bay area, and we also saw them when they lived in Tipton, CA. Betty, Earl's daughter was younger than me, but we still had a lot of fun together.

Dad was a red-head, like his father. He was about 5 feet 11 inches tall. He moved quickly and talked fast, and stayed slim and trim all of his life. His work was his life, and he had his office at home. I remember that his

phone was so important for his business, and we often had problems over the use, as I approached my teen years. Dad was excellent at math, (runs in the Callaway family), but it did not pass on to me. He was loyal to his family and during WWII we sheltered many of the Callaway relatives who were on their way to the Pacific theater. One of these was Joe Callaway, (Earl's son) who was serving in the Marine Corps. He and my sister Dorothy fell in love, and married. This union lasted 10 years. I loved Joe like a brother, he was very good to me, and it was a sad time when they divorced. Burl (Charley's son), and wife Mildred and their young son Robert stayed with us as well. Burl was in the Navy and served in the Pacific area. Dad had enclosed the downstairs basement, and turned it into a great little apartment so that every one had a cozy spot. The war years were hard on me, as a young girl growing up with all the rationing. I remember Dad giving me his shoe rationing cards, as I grew out of my shoes so fast. Blackout and air-raid sirens were everyday occurrences, and Dad did his part as an air-raid warden. They had lookout points to look for enemy planes that might be flying into the Bay area. He also contributed to the war effort through his business. He had many government contracts, and supplied the necessary sash and doors to complete their projects on time. He was also an active member of the American Legion. Dad could build almost anything. He and Mom built several homes in Albany prior to the depression, which still stand today. They remodeled several homes during their lifetime, taking a rundown house, and turning it into a lovely home and garden.

In Dad's later years he made a career change. After working for Wester Door and Sash Company for thirty five years he retired. He became restless, and went back to work part time for Loop Lumber Company in Oakland. That turned out to be the best move he had ever made. He was so happy with the company and he stayed until his health forced him to retire.

He was a father figure for my three sons twice in his adult life. The first time was when my first husband Hal was called up to serve in the Marine Corps during the Korean conflict. My first son Jim was born during this time, and I stayed with mom and dad while Hal was in Korea. Dad had the pleasure of becoming the father figure in his first grandson's life. He was a wonderful grandfather and loved his three grandsons with great devotion. (He actually had four grandsons. Ronald died at age 5 in 1958).

They adored him! Again he was called to be their father figure when Hal drowned in a tragic accident in 1969. Mom and Dad moved closer to me to help, and they were supportive of me and my family. He and his grandsons, Jeff and Steve were great companions. They shared time together fishing, enjoying little league baseball, and Dad was their biggest fan. He was very fond of my second husband, Wes, and they had many wonderful visits together. He also lived to see Jim married and meet his wonderful wife Elaine.

Dad lived to be 83 years old. He died peacefully on September 14, 1973. He had taken his walk that day, and due to heart problems, and asthma, he returned early. We were heartbroken, and missed him very much. I am so proud to have been his daughter.

W. E. Callaway was born on January 26, 1896 in Ennis, Texas, to his Father James Henry Callaway and Mother Emma Callaway. Dad was seven years old when his Mother Emma died. He was put into an orphanage along with some of the other young children for awhile. Dad told me that they weren't treated very well in the orphanage.

When James Henry remarried he was able to go back home to live. Dad never told us much about his early life. He did finish the seventh grade and was pretty much self taught. He told of living with his Uncle (on his mothers side) one summer on a farm out of Turkey, Texas where he met my Mother. Dad said he was picking cotton in one field and Mother was working in the next feild over. They were married in February 27, 1915 in Paducah , Texas, Dad was 19 and Mom was 17. Mom's maiden name was Sphronia Evalina Shinault. Their first child was a girl named Elva, she died at the age of four of pnomia in 1919. Their next child was a boy named Jack Quentin in June of 1919. Next came Joe Clista in May of 1921, Joe was born a twin but the other baby was still born. W. E. Callaway Junior was born in January of 1924 and Roy Dee was born in December of 1926. I, Carl Lindell in May of 1932 and Betty Jean in Febuary of 1936

My earliest memories were when we lived on a farm out of Wheeler, Texas in a community calle Corn Valley. This is where I was born in the midst of the Depression.

Before Jack was born , Uncle Jess who was Dads oldest brother wrote and told Dad he could get him a good paying job in the oilfields as a roughneck which is pretty much like todays common laborer. Dad told Mom that he would go and get established and then she and Elva would follow by train if things worked out. He got the job and sent for Mom and Elva , Dad's Father James Henry packed their belongings and shipped them. By the time Mom arrived Dad had quit his job. He told me that he hated the oily greasy work. He went to some lumber company and hired on for about half what the oil job payed. After he had worked there for a period of time the owner asked if he thought he could keep the books, Dad took the job and worked in the yard in the day and did the books at night. At that point Dad went to another lumber yard keeping the books, I think for more money( I think Uncle Charlie told him about the job,) in Spearman, Texas. Dad and Mom were doing quite well (this was before the depression.) Dad started building small rent houses on the side with borrowed money and had several. At this point he quit the lumber buisness and He and Mom put in a variety store which went over in a big way. Later on Dad put in a domino parlor which didn't do as well. Around that time they put in another variety store in Shamrock, Texas. The stock market crash of 1929 took everything. That's when they moved to the farm where I was born in 1932. The older boys helped Dad with the work and Dad raised most of our own food. By 1935 the economy was beginning to improve and Dad moved the family to town(Canadian, Texas) and started doing carpenter work as a General Contractor in Febuary 1936 Betty was born. Dad bought an old run down house and he and the boys completely remodeled it into a fine home.

In 1939 or 1940 Dad and a friend Mr. Vaught bought the Gulf oil wolesale plant in Candian, Texas and aquired the retail service station in town and delivered oil and gas to most all of the surrounding farmers. A little later Dad bought a small grocery Service station about ten miles south of town. It had been Sinclair Gas and Dad changed the name to Gulf Products. Roy and Pauline later operated it.

In 1940 my brother Joe joined the Marine Corps and was at Hickham Air Base in Honolulu, Hawaii on December 7 1941 when Pearl Harbor was attacked but he came through fine. Soon after that my brother Jack joined the Army and wound up in the Aleution Islands for about twenty monthes. He applied for a transfer to the Army Air Corps and got it. He came back to the States for training and became a top turret gunner on a B-29 in late 1942 or 1943. June 1943 Earl Jr joined the Navy and trained in San Diego, California. He never got to come home before shipping out as the war was going hot and heavy, all leaves were cancelled. November 27 the aircraft carrier (Liscome Bay) that he was on was sunk by a Japanese torpedo off Makin Island in the Gilberts with heavy loss of life including his. In early 1945 Joe finally came home after spending four and a half years overseas. He stayed for a while and went to California. He visited Uncle Floyd and fell in love with Dorthy their adopted daughter. They were married and Joe was sent to a Marine Base in Astoria Oregon . He and Dorthy had a small house on the base. In June 1945 Brother Jack was shot down over Kobe Japan. In August 1945 Mom and Dad decided to drive our old 1939 Plymouth to Astoria ,Oregon along with Carl and Betty to visit Joe and Dorthy. being in the oil business Dad had saved up on Gas ration stamps . We were in Price ,Utah when the war ended. Gas rationing ended the next day.

We visited Joe and Dorthy then came to the Bay Area and spent a couple of days visiting Floyd and Edna and Sandi, and Elizabeth and Darrel, and Robert and Virginia Then we continued on to Riverside, California and visited lots of moms relatives then on to Indio to visit Moms younger sister Aunt Amy. Then we returned back to Canadian, Texas.

Partly because of the loss of two sons Mom and Dad decided to move to California in May of 1946, They took Betty out of grammer School a couple of weeks early and went to California. I stayed with Roy and Pauline and finished the eighth grade. Dad bought four acres with an older home about twelve miles south of Tulare, California on highway 99. Dad sold the home in Canadian and we came to California. Roy and Pauline moved to California a few monthes later. Dad, Roy and I built a five cabin motel over the next few monthes. I lived there all through high school until I got married and moved to Hayward, California in the Bay Area. The family continued with the motel until the State Highway Department bought them out and widened the highway. By this time Betty and Dan had married so Dad and Mom moved to Hayward and bought a house on Alice Street, from there bought an old home with two lots on Soto Road and built a new home on the other lot. They sold that home to Carl and moved back to Alice Street. After That they moved To Portersville, California where we celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary in 1965. After Portersville they moved to Tracy, California and then to Newark, California.

Brother Joe was electrocuted when He and his two sons were attempting to raise a C.B. antenna and it hit some high voltage lines in 1976. Mom passed away from A heart Attack in 1978. Brother Roy was diagnosed with Leukemia a few years earlier and passed away in 1986. Dad sold the Newark house and moved into an adult Appt. complex in Newark, Aunt Edna lived in the same complex for awhile. From there as age took it's toll Dad went to a rest home in Fremont, Calif. So he could be supervised And taken care of. He was still sharp and alert, and still smoked his cigars. When I was young Dad smoked cigarettis and tried several times to quit, but finally said I may as well die from smoking as die wanting to. Dad caught A bad cold and was put in Washington Hospital in Fremont. The cold turned into Phnemonia and he could'nt fight it off. He passed away in December 1988, in January 1989 He would have been 93 years old.

Jack was in the U. S. AirForce during WWII and his plane was shot down over Kure Japan 6/22/1945 and he died. He was 6' with light brown hair. Jack was drafted into the Army shortly after Pearl Harbor and was shipped to the Aleution islands after boot camp, and spent 22 months there. He put in for a transfer to the Air Force and got it. He took his training in Clovis, NM and Lincoln, NE before being shipped to India. He was a top turrent gunner on a B-29. He was in the 20th AirForce, 468th Bomb Squadron. Crash took place on the Island of Schuchko, Japan. The report of one of the crew (Stanley V. Petric) reads: Direct hit on # 1 engine after bombs away. About 10 to 15 minutes time away from the target, gasoline started to leak from #2 engine which caught on fire and burned left wing. The plane started to spin and the reaction of the plane to the spin prevented any means of escape for the pilot, Navigator, Bombadier, Co-pilot, Engineer, Radar Operator, and Radio operator. Sgt. Prince did bail out, but due to severe burns, caused from the burning engine while bailing out died two days later in a civilian jail. Place of burial unknown to me. There were only 3 survivors of which one died in a Japanese jail in the next two days. Jack was reported Killed in Action 22 June 1945.

Notes for WILLIE EARL CALLAWAY, JR.:  
In the Navy during WWII and his ship, the aircraft carrier Liscome Bay sank 11/24/1943 Off Makin Island in the Gilbert Islands. U. S. Naval vessel, Escort carrier Liscome Bay (CVE-56) was sunk by submarine torpedo of the Japanese sumarine I-175, 02 degrees 58 minutes North, 172 degrees 26 minutes East. (Source: United States Naval Chronology World War II - published by United States Government Printing Office Washington: 1955.

He was 6' tall with light brown hair.

A description of the Sinking of the ship Liscome Bay is taken from the book: History of the United States

"The first light of day was in the sky at 0513 when a torpedo hit Liscome Bay amidships. There was a terrible explosion. A column of bright orange flame rose a thousand feet in the air. Within a few seconds the aircraft bombs stowed in the hold detonated, and with a mighty roar the carrier burst apart as though she were one great bomb, tossing men, planes, desk frames and molten fragments so high that the deck of "New Mexico" 1500 yards (almost a mile) to leeward was showered with fragments of steel, clothing, and human flesh. The entire after third of the escort carrier was demolished. Flames raced through her interior and arose from her flight deck as from a giant torch. Ammunition exploded, sending high bouquets of fire upward, the flight deck caved in, and only 23 minutes after being hit, the doomed ship flared up for the last time and sank hissing into a 2,000 fathom deep (2+miles).

Pitifully few survived to fight for their lives in a spreading pool of burning oil. Admiral Mullinix, Captain Wiltsie, 51 other officers and 591 enlisted men were lost; 55 Officers and 217 men were rescued, mostly by destroyers Morris and Hughes. Many were in frightful condition, with shattered limbs, internal hemorrhages, head concussions and horrible disfiguring burns; all were thickly covered and many blinded by viscous, stinging fuel oil. Yet many a man in the water when approached by a destroyer's whale boat said, "Never mind me; others need the boat more." and, if taken on board, turned to and helped the boat's crew rescue others. The energy and courage of the rescuers also was beyond praise. Electrician's Mate T. R. Furnas repeatedly dove into the oily sludge to get wounded men on board."

Herman was born on December 17, 1906 to Charles Luther Ford & Annie Jane Goodwin. They were living on an 80 acre farm in a community called Scatter Branch approx. 5 miles west of Greenville, TX. The family stayed there until 1916 when they moved to "Halfway" 12 miles west of Plainview to a 160 acre farm. He grew up there going to a one room school until he got to high school when he took room and board in Plainview. He graduated from Plainview High School in May of 1924. Herman graduated from West Texas State Teachers College in June of 1929. He and Fern married June 1, 1929 and they went to live at Prairieview, TX where Herman had secured his first teaching job. Prairieview is located approximately 7 miles north northeast of Plainview, TX in Hale County. He moved into the Plainview school system as principal of the Lamar grade school in 1932 and stayed there until 1939. He took the job as principal of Summit grade school in Amarillo in Sept. 1939 and while there built their first home on the corner of Line Avenue and Kentucky street in Amarillo. Jerry was born in 1933 and David in 1937. The family moved to White Deer, TX in the Spring of 1942 where Herman was the principal of the grade school. They moved several times in the next few years Skelly town, Amarillo, and Hereford in 1943. In 1945 Herman left teaching and went into the Life Insurance business in Hereford with the Southland Life Insurance Company. He did extremely well and in 1948 was made the company's branch manager in Amarillo. In September of 1951 he was named to build the company's "agents education department" in Dallas. For the next 17 years he headed that department and taught many agents, made a great many speeches, wrote many articles and was published far and wide. In May of 1968 he resigned and moved back to Hereford where he resumed selling life insurance. Again he did very well and for the next 11 years he and Fern had a nice life in Hereford. On February 28, 1979 he died suddenly of a heart attack.

He and his brothers had worked their way through college at West Texas State Teachers College and again at the University of Colorado where he got a masters degree in history. He was always know as a person of high integrity and loved far and wide. Herman was 6'1" tall and had brown hair and brown eyes. He started wearing glasses before he was 6 years old and started loosing his hair in his early 30's --- he always wanted to get his hair back ---- but never did. He epitomized the word integrity.
